#### THE BRANDT SCHOOL

The Willy Brandt School of Public Policy at the University of Erfurt is *one of Germany's leading policy schools*.

- We train future leaders in government, civil society, and private enterprise in addressing the complex public policy challenges of our time.
- We are home to cutting-edge research on key areas in sustainable development, climate change, inequality, digitalization and AI, peace, and geoeconomics.
- We generate impact by feeding results back to politics and society to inform evidence-based policy making.

The Brandt School is uniquely located in Thuringia's capital *Erfurt*, in the very center of the unified Germany. This is a region that left its mark on historical turning points, from the Reformation to the Weimar Republic, and maintains close infrastructural and intellectual ties to important metropolitan areas such as Berlin, Frankfurt, Prague, and Brussels, to name but a few.

#### THE MASTER OF PUBLIC POLICY

The Brandt School's Master of Public Policy (MPP) is a twoyear practice-oriented, international, and interdisciplinary graduate degree program. It is designed for young professionals who wish to pursue a career in public service, including government agencies, international organizations, and the non-profit sector.

Drawing from *political science*, *economics*, *sociology*, *public administration* and *law*, the MPP curriculum equips professional policy analysts and future decision makers with the knowledge and practical skills they will need to advance the public interest and make sound evidence-based policy decisions.

Throughout the coursework, research, and practice experience, students *develop a deep understanding of the involved institutions and actors as well as the processes that structure policy outcomes*.

#### PROGRAM STRUCTURE

MPP candidates study two years full-time, earning a total of *120 credit points* (ECTS). The first three semesters are dedicated to course work and the practical modules. During the fourth term, students write their thesis.

The core curriculum consists of the following mandatory modules:

## **Core Modules**

- Fundamentals of Public Policy an interdisciplinary introduction to the study of public policy, drawing on political science, economics, and law.
- Ethics in Public Policy addressing normative questions and value trade-offs in policy design and administration
- Research Design building the pathway to independent scholarly work, and preparing individual thesis projects.



In addition, students may choose two out of three elective subjects:

### **Core Electives**

- Comparative Public Policy theories, methods and approaches in comparative policy studies
- Public Administration bureaucracy, governance and public sector management for public service delivery
- Economics policy economics, cost-benefit analysis and performance assessment in public policy

# Language Module

Students improve their language competencies within several language modules. They may choose from a wide variety of languages. Basic German is compulsory for all students without prior knowledge of the language.

## **Practical Training Modules**

Bridging the gap to the policy world is an important part of our teaching philosophy. MPP students work with external professional partners and solve real-world policy challenges as part of a policy internship and a Capstone project.

The internship – completed between the second and third semester – is an essential component of the master's studies. It allows students to apply what they have learned in the classroom, gain a practical perspective on policy analysis and public management, and explore professional fields that match their interests and strengths. Students have completed internships at institutions such as the German Agency for International Cooperation (GIZ), the International Organization for Migration (IOM), the Inter-American Development Bank, UNESCO, Mercedes-Benz, SAP, and many others across the public, non-profit, and private sectors.

# **CAPSTONE PROJECTS**

During their third semester, MPP students implement a Capstone project under the supervision of an academic staff member. They work in teams to address a tangible public policy problem for an external 'client', thus creating impact already during their studies.

Past clients include development agencies such as the German Agency for International Cooperation (GIZ), climate consultancies like adelphi, state agencies like the Thuringian Agency for Digitalization, non-partisan and charitable organizations such as Transparency International, international institutions including the European Investment Bank and the European External Action Service, and philanthropies such as the Open Society Foundations.

### **CAREER OPPORTUNITIES**

The program prepares students for *careers in state-level* and national governments, public administration, international organizations, civil society, think tanks, and private companies, including consultancies.

Mainly training policy analysts and future leaders, the MPP has also paved the way for many alumni to work as social entrepreneurs, diplomats, development experts, politicians, journalists, managers, and researchers.



## **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

- higher education entrance qualification (i.e., high school diploma)
- college or university degree (i.e., Bachelor, Master, Diploma, state exam, etc.) with a duration of at least six semesters, ideally in subjects from the social sciences, economics, or law
- professional work experience (minimum of one year)
- above-average grades or above-average professional performance
- strong analytical skills and pronounced interest in solving political problems
- excellent English language proficiency (TOEFL iBT: minimum 90 points, IELTS: minimum of 6.5 points in all disciplines, Cambridge CAE or CPE)



#### **APPLICATION**

The online application portal opens each year on *January 1*. We strongly recommend submitting your application by the Priority Deadline of *February 28* to maximize your chances for early admission.

For applicants requiring a student visa, the non-priority (visa-relevant) deadline is *April 30*. Applicants from EU/EFTA countries or those not needing a visa prior to arrival may apply until *July 15*, which is the final deadline for admission. The MPP programme officially begins on *October 1*.
