Part 1: Introduction to AI in research

2.15 – 3.45 pm | Zaryab Chaudhry, University of Weimar/eTeach

This workshop introduces participants to the fundamental concepts and functions of artificial intelligence. Using the eTeach 'Prompting Station' you will learn to distinguish between different types of AI tools—such as text, image, and data-based systems—and to evaluate their potentials and limitations. The session also addresses the creation of effective prompts for teaching purposes and highlights important ethical considerations and biases in the use of AI.

Part 2: AI-supported data collection and analysis

In this session, participants learn how to create a corpus for data-driven analysis and how to use computational techniques in the social sciences.
