The Research and Graduate Services

The team of the Research and Graduate Services develops strategies and concepts directing research, research funding and the promotion of early career researchers at the University of Erfurt.

In close cooperation with the university governance and numerous researchers, we focus on ideas for research and fundings and transfer these into various programs, instruments and events, which we implement and supervise. In addition, we support researchers at the University of Erfurt, who aim to receive external funding for their research projects.

The Research and Graduate Services is generally available for consulting at every career level. In addition to comprehensive, personal consulting services, we offer doctoral candidates structural and financial support (e.g. by memberships in the Graduate Centers or by organizing workplaces, scholarships). Furthermore, we provide opportunities for exchange and networking with other doctoral researchers through formats such as the Christoph Martin Wieland Graduate Forum Discussions, the Science Slam, and various information events, a platform for discussions with other doctoral candidates or presenting your own research beyond your usual expert audience (e.g. the Christoph Martin Wieland Forum Discussions or the Erfurt Science Slam).

UNIVERSITY-WIDE FUNDINGS AND EVENT ANNOUNCEMENTS

CMW Forum Discussion: Good Supervision – Constructively Shaping Supervision and Power Relationships

How can good supervision be achieved during doctoral studies? RESEARCH AND GRADUATE SERVICES

Project Funding

The funding opportunity is aimed at all university teachers, post-doctoral researchers and doctoral students who are members of the University of Erfurt and who are planning a research project that they want to conduct at the University of Erfurt.

Funding is possible up to a maximum of EUR 5,000. The funds can be requested for research assistants, material resources, funds for external work contracts, travel costs and funds for workshops. All activities must be completed within one year.

Funding of the Research and Graduate Services is subject to available funds and a positive assessment of the project by the members of the research committee.

APPLICATION AND AWARDING PROCEDURE

The award decision is made by a vote of the members of the research committee after the application has been formally reviewed by the staff unit Research and Graduate Services.

Applications for internal university project funding can be submitted to the staff unit Research and Graduate Services by *15 September*. A total of up to EUR 20,000 in funding can be awarded per round of tenders.

OFFICE FOR EQUAL OPPORTUNITY AND FAMILY SERVICES

Funding opportunities from the Equal Opportunities and Family Office

1) For female* fellows (EPPP full members): Reimbursement of research costs

From the budget for equality-promoting measures of the Equal Opportunities and Family Office, it is possible for female* doctoral students (EPPP full members) to be reimbursed an additional EUR 300 per year for research costs. All doctoral candidates* and postdoctoral researchers* (with gender entry female, diverse or without specification) who belong to an EPPP-certified Graduate Centre or the Max Weber Kolleg and are registered as full members with the Research and Graduates Services are eligible to apply.

2) For female* academic staff: Reimbursement of research costs

Research costs for research assistants* (gender entry female, diverse or not specified) can be covered from the budget for equality-promoting measures of the Equal Opportunities and Family Office - e.g. for conference trips, for test subjects, data access, additional equipment, etc. Funding of up to EUR 500 per year can be applied for.

Please note: It is not possible to combine funding as a research fellow* AND as a research assistant* from the Equal Opportunities and Family Office within the same year.

INFORMATION FROM THE COMMITTEE OF PHD REPRESENTATIVES

The Committee of PhD Representatives represents the doctoral candidates at the University of Erfurt. It promotes the interdisciplinary, cooperative, and international doctoral culture at the University of Erfurt, and campaigns for the interests of doctoral candidates in the university's internal committees.

With various events, it also provides information on topics relevant to the doctorate and contributes to interdisciplinary and inter-faculty exchange and networking among doctoral candidates.

The Committee of PhD Representatives is made up of one member and one deputy per faculty and the Max-Weber-Kolleg. The term of office is one year and starts on 1 October each year.

THE EPPP GRADUATE CENTRES / MAX WEBER KOLLEG

The university's own funded Graduate Centres are a specific feature at the University of Erfurt: they are the supporting pillars of the structured promotion of early stage re-

searchers at the University of Erfurt and are based on the [Erfurt Doctoral and Postdoctoral Programme \(EPPP\)](#). They serve to support, supervise and qualify young academics at different stages of their careers.

Within the framework of the EPPP, Graduate Centres pursue a research-oriented guiding theme. The professional and interdisciplinary qualification of the early stage researchers is supported in a structured and target-oriented way.

Opportunities for Early-Career Researchers: Research in the USA with Fulbright

The Fulbright PhD programme gives you the chance to get a scholarship at a university or research institution in the USA. We support four- to six-month research projects starting between **1 August and 31 December 2027**.

The scholarship covers living costs in the USA at 2,400 euros/month and, if applicable, allowances for accompanying family members. It provides health/accident insurance, fee-free Fulbright J-1 visa sponsorship, participation in the Fulbright Seminar from 22 to 25 April 2027, and entry into the international Fulbright network.

Opportunities for Early-Career Researchers: Research and/or teaching in the USA with Fulbright

The "Research & Teaching" programme gives you the chance to receive a scholarship at a university or scientific institution in the USA. We support three- to nine-month research and teaching projects starting between **1 August 2027 and 31 May 2028**.

The scholarship covers living costs in the USA at 3,000 euros/month and, if applicable, allowances for accompanying family members. It offers health/accident insurance, free Fulbright J-1 visa sponsorship, participation in the Fulbright Seminar from 22 to 25 April 2027, and inclusion in the international Fulbright network.

Voltaire Prize 2027

The University of Potsdam will award the Voltaire Prize for Tolerance, International Understanding and Respect for Difference again in 2027. The prize will go to a scientist in the early stage of their career for contributions to social dialogue or for commitment to academic freedom and freedom of expression.

The prize is worth €5,000 and is funded by the Friede Springer Foundation. The award ceremony will take place in January 2027. Nominations must be made by third parties (no self-nominations) and submitted online in German or English.

Wilhelm Liebknecht Prize

The prize is awarded for outstanding historical and social science publications that deal with the social foundations for building and securing democratic communities. It recognises independent work by individual researchers. In exceptional cases, the prize can be awarded to a research group.

The 'Wilhelm Liebknecht Prize' is endowed with 2,500 euros and is awarded every two years. For the 2027 Wilhelm Liebknecht Prize, submissions can be works published between **01.01.2025 and 31.12.2026**. Along with a cover letter and any reference letters, a digital version of the work must be submitted.

Funding programmes of the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science

The Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS) research fellowship supports you, as a highly qualified postdoctoral researcher from Germany, in your research project in Japan – regardless of your field of study.

There are two different funding streams: Short-term Postdoctoral Fellowships, which fund research stays of 1–12 months, and Standard Postdoctoral Fellowships for research stays of 12–24 months. The Alexander von Humboldt Foundation is responsible for selecting applicants on behalf of the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS) for funding periods of six months or longer. The DAAD selects the fellows with shorter funding periods in the Short-Term Programme. Up to 17 JSPS Postdoctoral Fellowships (short-term) and up to 12 JSPS Postdoctoral Fellowships (standard) are awarded annually.
