Formalities

Application (How do I apply?)	Deadline for exchange studies application: 30 November 2025
	Please refer to the application information and checklist.
<u>Health insurance</u>	EU countries/Turkey : Shortly before arrival, exchange students must
	present the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) / an AT11certificate
	(Turkey) that they have received from their national insurance company.
	Other countries without a bilateral agreement (non-EU): Health
	insurance/travel insurance is not recognised and is not sufficient for
	matriculation and registration. Students up to the age of 30 must take out
	statutory health insurance in Germany, for example through AOK Plus.
AOK Plus	Current costs for statutory student health insurance: approx. 150 € per month.
Semester contribution	approx. 330 € per semester. To be paid by each student.

Language requirements

We recommend German basic skills (A2). English B2 is required for International Relations, Social Sciences, Economics, Law, Communication Sciences and, generally, if you wish to attend courses taught in English.

You will receive further information about the exchange programme together with your admission letter and then further information a few weeks before your arrival.
