Winter semester 2024/25: Important Dates

Application period:	01/03/ – 15/06/2024
Arrival period, if you participate in German Intensive Course:	Arrival: 12/09/ – 15/09/2024 The Intensive Course takes place from 16/09/ – 11/10/2024 .
Arrival period, if you participate in Orientation Week:	Arrival: 01/10/ - 06/10/2024 The Orientation Week takes place from 07/10/ – 11/10/2024 .
Duration of semester session:	14/10/ - 07/02/2025, exams may follow
You either participate in the Intensive Course <u>or</u> the Orientation Week.	

German Intensive Course

Free comprehensive language and orientation course to improve your German skills. Listening and reading comprehension, writing and oral expression, German culture, history and politics. Language levels: A1-B1 . Online assessment test briefly before arrival, organized by the Language Center.	
Participants / requirements:	Basic German knowledge is recommendable but not mandatory. Students with intermediate level of German or second-year students of German Studies will not be admitted to the Intensive Course.
Duration:	4 weeks, Monday to Friday, approx. 80 lessons of German
Course Winter Semester 2024:	16/09/ - 11/10/2024
The Course is part of the Preparatory Weeks, that also comprise enrolment procedure and study preparation. Course is awarded with 6 ECTS upon successful participation. Please report your arrival date (arrival times see above) to the International Office and keep us updated about any changes to your arrival plan.

Formalities

Application:	Deadline: 15/06/2024; Application (4 application steps)
Health Insurance:	EU countries: Exchange students must present the European insurance card obtained from their domestic national insurance.
	Countries without bilateral agreement: Health insurances/travel insurances are <u>not recognised and not sufficient for enrolment</u> . Students must buy German statutory health insurance! Costs for statutory student health insurance: approx. € 125 per month.
Semester Contribution:	approx. € 300 per semester.
	The student identification card (thoska) includes the <i>semester ticket</i> which entitles you to travel on the city routes of the Erfurt transport system and on the local trains within Thuringia. You will receive instruction about how to receive the thoska in time.



Meals

<p>The university's student cafeteria (<i>Mensa</i>) offers breakfast and lunch from Monday until Friday at reasonable prices. Vegetarian food is on offer, too. All the student halls of residence have cooking facilities.</p>
