Health Insurance:	EU countries : Exchange students must present the European insurance	
	card obtained from their domestic national insurance.	
	Countries without bilateral agreement: Health insurances/travel	
	insurances are <u>not recognised and not sufficient for enrolment</u> . Students	
	must buy German statutory health insurance ! Costs for statutory student	
	health insurance: approx. € 125 per month.	
Semester Contribution:	approx. € 300 per semester.	
	The student identification card (thoska) includes the semester ticket which	
	entitles you to travel on the city routes of the Erfurt transport system ar	
	the local trains within Thuringia. You will receive instruction about how to	
	receive the thoska in time.
