#### The age of the actorless threats has arrived

Climate change gives rise to cascading risks of habitat destruction, infectious disease outbreaks or biodiversity loss and these threats have already started to cause loss of life at significant scales. Professor Goldthau argues in a co-authored piece, published on the Duck of Minerva, that democracies are best suited to identify credible ways to respect and work within planetary boundaries when heeding the call of a sustainable security paradigm addressing actorless threats.
