<b>Workshop</b>	<p>During this workshop, filmmaker Toyah Van der Poten (Department of Sociology/CESSMIR) will show how research can translate in different forms. Combined with her master thesis research in Sociology, she produced a short documentary film (+- 20 min.) that shows a different/ additional side to the stories of the participants. The documentary gives new perspectives on the research and makes the story and outcome of the master thesis more accessible to a larger public. After the film there's a short presentation on different research formats and working towards inclusion. There's time for discussion on the role of the researcher, seeing and sharing research in different/ accessible ways and agency and inclusion for participants.</p>
